

They have installed cable tray, rigid conduit, and pulled wire. Over the last several months, they have installed equipment that is on the roof and in the panel room. Including a new PLC cabinet, new fiber, a 4160 cable for a new chiller, a new lineup of switchgear and lots of wire to run all of the new equipment. Up to 10 guys have been added over the last couple of weeks to finish the work by Tyson's May 15th completion date.



Seaton Construction is back on the job in Wichita Falls. We are scheduled to set the generator on April 29th, and have our tie-in outage scheduled for May 18th. Richard Claycamp is the foreman on the project.
